

KEY STAGE 2 RESULTS 2023

In Key Stage 2 this year, the children have been the third cohort to take tests from the new national curriculum. The measure that we have used is to compare our results to the national average in terms of how many children achieved the 'Expected Standard' set by the government. I am sure that you will agree that our children have performed very well. We have also added a comparison of the children working at a 'Greater Depth' at our school with the national figures.



Each child is given a 'scaled score' from their tests. Children who achieve above 100 are deemed to have met the 'Expected Standard.'

At the bottom of the list is the progress measure. 0.0 is the national average measure. Any score above this is therefore above the national average in terms of progress from Key stage 1 to Key Stage 2. Any figure below 0.0 is below the national average in terms of progress from Key stage 1 to Key Stage 2.
