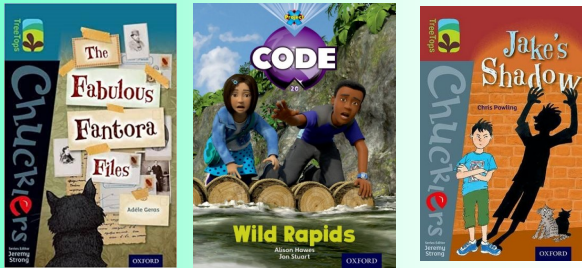


Reading in KS2

What is your child reading?

Your child is given a reading book which closely matches their reading ability. Your child should be able to read their book most independently, but they may need help with trickier words.

The books come from Oxford Reading Tree and may look like one of these.



How can I help with reading?

In the front or back pages of lots of books, there are questions you ask your child before, during and after reading their book.

There are also some tips and questions to ask in the first page of your child's reading record.

Here are some questions which you can ask for every type of book

- What happened when you read last time?
- Can you summarise the book so far?
- What do you think will happen next?
- Who is your favourite/ least favourite character? Why?
- Is this book similar to any you have read before?
- Would you recommend this book to someone else? Why or why not?

How often should my child read at home?

The more, the better!

However, you should aim to read with your child at least 3 times a week. As your child gets older, they may be able to read by themselves.

Remember to always write in your child's reading record whenever they read with you at home.
