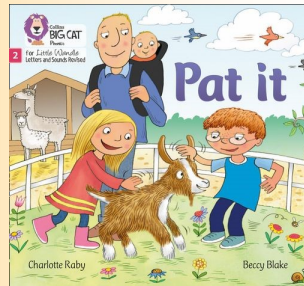
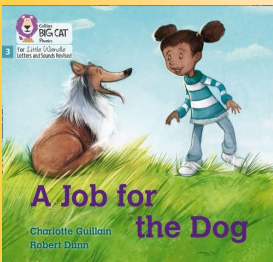


Reading in Reception

What is your child reading?

Your child is given two reading books each week. One of them is their Little Wandle book which is closely matched to the sounds they are learning in school. Your child should be able to read nearly all of the words in the book by themselves. They have already read this book in school. They also receive a reading for pleasure book. This is a book for you and your child to share together.



How can I help with reading?

Little Wandle book

Your child should be able to read all of the words in the book, but may struggle with some sounds. You can help your child by 'breaking down' the words into the individual sounds

Eg sail would be s - ai - l.

Reading for pleasure book

These are some questions you can share with your child

- Do you like the book?
- Who is your favourite character?
- What do you think will happen next?
- What happened last time we read the story?

How often should my child read at home?

The more, the better!

Your child will be given their books on Thursdays. They need to be returned on Monday so that they can be checked.

Every time you read with your child, either their Little Wandle or their reading for pleasure book, make sure you record it in their reading record.
